Enhancing Cost-of-Care Conversations for Low Back Pain Treatment Using Publicly Reported Cost Information

Kimberley Fox, MPA, is a Senior Research Associate at the Muskie School of Public Service at the University of Southern Maine. Trained in public administration with an emphasis in health policy, her research focuses on improving health care access, quality and affordability and reducing health disparities for low-income at-risk populations in Maine and nationally.

Ms. Fox has led numerous primary care quality improvement evaluations in Maine including MaineCare's Improving Health Outcomes for Children (IHOC)/CHIPRA quality demonstration initiative and Health Home initiatives, and Maine Health Access Foundation (MeHAF)'s Medication Assistance Initiative to improve prescription drug access for under or uninsured Mainers. She provides technical assistance to the Maine Quality Forum to identify quality measures for public reporting and works with the Rural Telehealth Research Center in evaluating effectiveness of telehealth grant programs funded by the Federal Office for Rural Health Policy. Ms. Fox is currently the Principal Investigator on a study funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) to enhance cost of care conversations in the primary care setting using publicly reported cost information.
